We are now in “full swing” of the Season at TW. I hope everyone enjoyed the holiday time with family and friends. We have a busy and important couple of months in front of us. January 23 will be the annual meeting at which time we will vote for three board members. At the present time, there are four candidates to fill three positions, so it is important to vote for the candidates of your choice. At that same meeting, we will vote for approval to build a storage building and approval to move money from our reserve account to the regular budget to fund the building. The vote requires a majority of a quorum in order to pass. In numerical terms, that means we need 183 unit owners to vote either by proxy or at the meeting with a minimum of 93 yes votes for approval. I believe the storage building is very important for our community, and I encourage you to attend the meeting and vote YES to approve. Those unable to attend the meeting, please vote by proxy.

The following is taken from the September, 1988 Tangerine Topics President Mil Fisher. The content of the article is as appropriate or even more pertinent today as it was in 1988.



“For many of us, living in a condominium environment is a new experience. We may have owned our own homes in other parts of the country, and as long as we followed some general rules, our property was our own to do with as we pleased. In a condominium situation such as TW, it is often difficult to accept the fact that rules and regulations must be set up and administered for the “good of the community.” The condominium concept only works when all owners understand that they are responsible, not only for their own individual homes, but also for the maintenance and operation of “common property”, including streets, rec hall, pool, hot tub, tennis, bocce, and shuffleboard courts, parking lots, lakes, and entry gates. When we have guests or renters, it is up to us to inform them of the rules. Board members do not want to be on constant sentry duty

Each resident must share responsibilities as you all share expenses. This is part of condominium living. TW is a beautiful place because we conform to a number of regulations designed to keep it that way. Most of us are retired, hoping to relax and enjoy life, but that doesn't mean abdicating our obligations to one another.”

Mr. Fisher's article carries the same message I have referred to during our Board meetings. Let's all join together in keeping TW a beautiful and well maintained community. Please review the “Rules and Regulations” so we can all fulfill our obligations. Remember to attend the January 23 meeting and vote.



1. Please be advised that the management office will be doing site inspections in the very near future. It is important that you consult your rules and regulations to make sure you are in compliance. If we find any violations, a letter will be sent to you to correct the violations.



OUR CANADIAN NEIGHBORS

On December 2, 2017, Saturday Coffee was hosted by our Canadian residents. They were sharing their recognition of Canada's sesquicentennial, a celebration of their independence from England in 1887. They made it special in so many ways. They brought gifts of Canadian goodies that were won during 50/50, and along with the usual assortment of donuts, the ladies made scrumptious muffins and other baked goods popular in their realm of our continent. Jerry Giff entertained us with anecdotes about his fellow countrymen and a repertoire of jokes that had the room shaking with laughter. The coffee crew that morning was a fine representation of our Canadian neighbors. Later I discovered there are 18 Canadians living among us in TW.

Some have been neighbors for 24 years, while the rest chose their homes anywhere from two to fourteen years ago. Among them are two former and one current teacher plus retirees from banking, construction, accounting, home inspection, several service related positions, management, civil service, color and fashion consulting, and even a former member of the Royal Canadian Air Force. Most found TW through friends who enticed them into a visit, and some found it on their own. One couple came to Venice for their honeymoon, eventually finding TW, and the rest is history.

When asked why they chose TW, they said, "The people are so friendly." The appearance of the community was a factor for most, while the lower cost of quarterly dues and ownership of the property were important to others. The size and design attracted some, while our dog friendly policy, the pool, tennis courts and the activities drew others. Community participation was an attraction as well. Generally, the comment was, "What's not to like, EH?"

These fine neighbors are involved in everything. They told me they are encouraged to cultivate the culture of volunteerism in their schools, churches, and workplaces. Anyone involved in decorating the Clubhouse for Christmas has met Lois and Clare Campbell. They bring Christmas alive. Their effort is on display every Christmas season as they provide their talents, labor, and expertise to our community's Christmas decorations. If it weren't for the Canadians, there would be no Tiki Fridays, and when George Preziosi retired from cooking our monthly Pancake Breakfasts, Jim Carrey stepped in to fill his shoes. Canadians are involved in Relay For Life, both in cooking for the Spaghetti Dinner and the other work related to this fine charity. They take an active part in the Flea Market, selling tickets and finding gifts for the raffles that are part of the enterprise. They donate blood at our Blood Drives, and engage in the many social activities we offer. One

gentleman even teaches tennis to residents. In fact, their advice is to continue the expansion of the recreational services and upkeep of the property in order to keep values at a premium. They do have one complaint—the US government allows them to stay in this country for only six months a year. They'd probably stay for the eight months their government allows if that rule changed. They did mention the Senate and Congress have been discussing this issue for five years. EH!




