RED TIDE UPDATE

Red tide develops 10–40 miles offshore away from man-made nutrients.

There are no practical or acceptable ways to control red tide blooms. One of the cleverest innovations of dealing with the red tide problem comes from a group called Sarasota Bay Watch. They have released 250,000 clams to filter and accumulate red tide toxin. The Florida Department of Agriculture controls shellfish harvesting, and they take samples of clams to test for red tide. Clams are the canary in the coalmine and a good monitoring device for red tide in inshore waters. This is a beautiful plan. The clam farmers get to sell clams with red tide in them that can't be sold as food. Sarasota Bay gets the benefit of cleaner water, and we get a red tide monitoring device. These free-range clams have a lot of potential, and when red tide flushes out of them in 5-7 days, people can eat them. (Thanks to Mike Barrett for this article idea.)




