A Morning to Remember – Saturday, October 11, 2025, will be a morning remembered by many at Tangerine Woods!

The couples scheduled for coffee duty included Char and Mike Gineo and Lynne Klein & Dave Flemma: they arrived ready to serve up smiles and caffeine. But at 6:45 a.m., the day took an unexpected turn – as the Gineos pulled up to the back of the clubhouse, water was pouring out of the kitchen door! Armed with two shop vacs, a wide squeegee, two mops, and plenty of towels, the clean-up crew jumped into action. The culprit? The newly repaired coffee pot, which had sprung a leak sometime overnight. When the Coffee Committee left at 4:30 p.m. Friday, everything was dry – so the mystery remains as to when the leak began. Despite the early morning chaos, the coffee team rallied. Thanks to the trusty old percolator, hot coffee and donuts were served right on schedule, and residents were none the wiser – or at least well-cafeinated enough not to mind! And yes, the table was proudly decorated in New York Giants regalia, celebrating their Thursday night win over the Super Bowl Champion Eagles. By Saturday afternoon, Stan's Coffee Company had fixed the leak, and all floors – including the Kitchen, Ladies' Restroom, Electrical Room, Great Room, and Exercise Room – were dry. Let's hope this was a once-in-a-lifetime event for Saturday Coffee!

Planning Ahead – Our Updated Reserve Study

Earlier this year, Board Member Mike Muzzey suggested updating our Reserve Study, and the Board approved the project this summer. As luck would have it, the Florida Legislature recently passed a new law – effective July 2025 requiring condominium associations to complete a reserve study every three years. Our current study, dated 2026, keeps us compliant through 2028, covering the financial plan for 2029. So, why conduct a reserve study? It provides the association with a roadmap to fund future major repairs and replacements in a timely, responsible manner – ensuring our community stays well-maintained without unexpected financial surprises. The same company that completed our last study returned this year, meeting with Angie to review updates to our amenities and common grounds. They carefully evaluated each element, estimating its remaining useful life and future replacement costs. Economic trends specific to our community were also considered to ensure realistic, forward-thinking projections. Now the Budget Committee is aware and prepared to allow for funding our Reserves.

In short – we're planning wisely for the future, even as we mop up the past!

HONORING SERVICE: LEN WarBURTON'S SOUTHWEST FLORIDA HONOR FLIGHT

On October 14, 2025, our neighbor, Len Warburton embarked on a moving journey to Washington, DC as part of Mission XXIII of the Southwest Florida Honor Flight. Len's son Wayne accompanied him as a Guardian, adding a deeply personal dimension to a day dedicated to honoring veterans for their service and sacrifice.

In Len's own words, being selected for the Honor Flight was a privilege and surprise. "I didn't expect to be chosen, but I applied and it was the experience of a lifetime. Thank you all!" Len emphasized the importance of the program's accessibility: "Veterans, you don't have to have served in combat to qualify. If you wore the uniform, you're eligible—don't hesitate to send in your application."

The day began before dawn, with veterans and guardians assembling at SRQ airport. The Southwest Florida Honor Flight team had orchestrated every detail for comfort and meaning. The flight itself included 79 veterans ranging from World War II to the Vietnam era, with the average vet age at 70. Four brother veterans attended together, as did the first "Mother, Father, Son" trio. Fourteen female vets were present, along with a team of doctors, EMTs, and community volunteers.

Their tour of Washington commemorated America's military history. Stops included the World War II Memorial, where a wall of 4,000 gold stars represents over 400,000 Americans who sacrificed their lives. At the Korean War Memorial, Len described walking among 19 statues, "spread over the terrain as if on patrol... It was so life-like, I

felt I was there with them." The Vietnam Veterans Memorial left the deepest mark. "The people at the wall, tracing names of lost friends or relatives, with tears streaming down—it was unforgettable," Len recalled. "Each memorial brought moments of reflection and gratitude."

The group visited the Lincoln Memorial to see the Gettysburg Address etched in stone. At the Military Women's Memorial, Len learned about the distinguished history of women in service dating back to the Spanish-American War. Arlington National Cemetery provided a profound conclusion with the changing of the guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, accompanied by a rare civilian wreath ceremony.

A highlight for Len was the "mail call" on the return flight: each veteran received dozens of cards and notes from neighbors, schoolchildren, and strangers expressing thanks. Upon returning to Sarasota, a crowd of more than 150 community members—family, firefighters, veteran groups, scouts—welcomed the travelers home.

Len also shared personal anecdotes from his Army career, from assignments during the Berlin Wall crisis, Cuban Missile Crisis, and leadership as an engineer and company commander with bridging units. His reflections remind us that military service stretches far beyond battlefields—it's about dedication, teamwork, and enduring bonds.

Len's parting message resonates: "If you're a veteran, sign up! Don't let doubts keep you from an experience and recognition you deserve. The Honor Flight is well worth it – well organized, deeply meaningful, truly unforgettable and – and worthy of our support."

Let's celebrate Len Warburton's service and the enduring spirit of Tangerine Woods veterans who remind us every day of the true meaning of honor.


