

There have been many distractions around our home of late and because of that, the warnings about Irma were either ignored or never heard. Consequently, on the Wednesday before it was predicted to hit Englewood with Category 4 winds and who knows what surge, we hadn't heard word one about its imminent arrival. That was also about the time our friends and neighbors began calling us to ask where we were going to avoid the devastation that was expected. Going? Why would we be going, a family conference ensued. Where to go? What would we need? Too many questions and lo and behold, much too late to be asking questions of any kind. My first action was to look online for a place to go. My darling soulmate said, "We need to get out of Florida." We had finally turned on the weather channel to find that we were predicted to be hit with a Category 4 hurricane and it was to be a "direct hit." I searched through Georgia and Alabama only to find, "There was no room at the inns." I even tried cottage and condo rentals where I had the amazing luck to find lots of availability on the coasts of any state I pulled up. That wasn't going to work. I finally convinced soulmate that all we needed was a brick and mortar structure to protect us (he wasn't really convinced), and I called my best friend who lives in Englewood Isles. She was happy to have us and our two small dogs. The next crisis was what to take with us. After all, we would not have a home to come back to if the prognosticators were correct. Soulmate suggested we clear out the safe, take any worthwhile jewelry, non-perishable food for at least a week, and as many clothes as we could fit in the car. That, of course, was after we packed enough water, dog food, dog beds, our pillows, medications, electronics (I insisted that the TV's remain in the house) and any perishables that we thought my friend could accommodate in her refrigerator. By then, there was so much stuff in the van that we were never going to find anything (and we didn't.) We finally arrived in Englewood Isles, where my friend had cleared out a space in her two car garage, and we felt a modicum of safety. The space in the garage was so tight that I had to suck in my gut to get out of the car. Thankfully, access to the "stuff" we brought could be accessed from the rear, and I could let the dogs and soulmate out before squeezing into the allotted space.

I must have gone out to the van at least a dozen times looking for something that became "necessary." I never did find the emergency band radio that had been packed. As it turned out, by the time Irma arrived in Englewood, it had be downgraded to a Category 2, bordering on a Category 1, and while there was damage to some of the homes in TW, the houses were all essentially intact. We spent Saturday and Sunday in Englewood Isles watching through the sliding glass doors as the wind played havoc with the trees and vegetation. The dogs didn't mind going out in the rain, and even enjoyed watching the spectacle. We were home by 11 am on Monday to a home that lost a few shingles and a gorgeous, fully loaded avocado tree. Praise God!! My friend lost power early Monday as Irma plowed north while we regained power that same early afternoon allowing us to help her in a small way by storing her perishables and frozen goods and feeding her for a couple of days. So when do we go back to Indian Mound?


