

YESTERDAY

Well, it wasn't exactly yesterday. It was several weeks ago. We were happy. We were talking and planning our next adventure. Seems like we were always planning to go somewhere, usually a place we had yet to discover. But that was yesterday. Today and all the todays after that have been filled with confusion, his and mine. He wouldn't wake up for more than a moment. Made the call to 911 and a couple of gentlemen and an ambulance whisked him away. What followed has been a whirlwind of tests and more tests. All the tests came back negative - the medical professionals were baffled. They could find no medical reasons for why he was effectively unresponsive. Day after day, eight hours or more, I watched and talked to him. The first week, I was sure he knew who I was. I am still sure. He spoke and sometimes he made whole sentences. That delighted and encouraged me. But soon it was obvious that the sentences didn't comprise whole thoughts. He sleeps most of the time. His body is connected to IVs that supply him with water and medications. Those are drained from his body through a catheter and an army of caring professionals keep him clean and dry. Today is day 14 and he has made no attempt to feed himself. The little that I can get him to eat would fill a tablespoon and that is for the entire time he has been hospitalized. The other patients on this floor have mostly been released to their loving families. The doctors are telling me that since there is nothing they can treat, we need to think of other ways to care for him. I made a promise to him that I would not place him in a nursing home. I want to keep that promise. Every morning I come here optimistic and every evening it is a struggle to keep the tears from distorting my vision as I drive home to an empty house. I know what I should do. We discussed all of the options ad nauseum while we were both happy and healthy. Now that one of us is neither, the reality is unbearable. I can't believe how crushingly difficult it is to accept. There no longer is any logic; there is only paralyzing emotional stress. Until a person experiences this, it cannot be explained. I can't talk about what I am feeling. Thankfully, our son will soon be here to help make decisions that are too hard for me to make on my own. It is no longer yesterday, a day filled with hopes, dreams and promise. It is today, a day that no matter what the decision, it will not feel good. Our son arrived and his Dad knew he was here and suddenly there was no longer a necessity to make a decision. No more todays or tomorrows, only yesterdays.




