


VETERAN REMEMBRANCES

Mike Cameron's journey began unexpectedly - he was drafted on his twenty-first birthday while taking a quarter off from college to earn his tuition, convinced he would be safe from the draft during the short break. Instead, he found himself reporting to Fort Jackson, running the infamous Tank Hill in South Carolina, and scoring well enough to be considered for stateside duty. But Mike opted for the unknown, ultimately receiving orders for Vietnam after advanced survival training in the swamps.

Landing in Tan Son Nhut Air Base, Mike was driven to Saigon and then flown 300 miles north to Da Nang. He landed at night, was given an M16 and ammo, and then loaded into a deuce and a half for a harrowing drive even further north to Bloody Beach. His introduction to the war came swiftly that night: the ground trembled as the USS New

Jersey fired its sixteen-inch guns offshore right over the base, rattling nerves and providing a stark welcome. Initially Mike trained as a personnel specialist, he served as an infantry rifleman and was quickly promoted to NCO in charge of the reactionary squad. Patrols at night, manning observation and listening posts near villages, defending the base, saving the ammo dump, during an attack, and tragic loss during booby-trap sweeps became routine. His quick thinking saved comrades and earned him a medal, but the cost was high.

One of the most harrowing nights came with a firefight near the perimeter; Mike's squad, manning a listening post outside the fence, found themselves separated from the base by a large enemy force attacking the perimeter. To avoid outgoing fire, they hugged the ground and remained undetected as the Viet Cong force retreated directly over their position.

When his squad disbanded, Mike joined Huey Pilot Captain Craw as a door gunner, high-risk duty that delivered both camaraderie and loss. Missions included flying over the North Vietnam border and surviving multiple helicopter hits while checking out a firefight. Mike narrowly escaped death multiple times, both in The air and on the ground. Mike's bravery extended beyond combat. He received the Soldier's Medal for saving a drowning fellow soldier and was recognized in Saigon.

Amid the hardship, one memory stands out in startling contrast: Bob Hope's Christmas visit to Freedom Hill, Da Nang,in 1969. Hope's arrival brought a rare taste of home to the only Army unit in the area, they were joined by Marines and Green Berets, with dancers, comedians, and NFL celebrities performing. The show was a nervewracking treat, as helicopter gunships circled for protection against mortars and rockets. For Mike, it was as much an act of courage as any on the battlefield. He never forgot Hope's generosity and humor, a beacon for soldiers far from home – a hero in his own right.

Throughout his service, Mike witnessed the unwavering dedication of military nurses. Working under constant threat and caring for critically wounded young men, these women showed uncommon courage and compassion and never received the recognition they deserved.

Mike Cameron's experiences in Vietnam highlight the resilience, sacrifice, and humanity that defined his generation - facing fear, loss, and uncertainty with courage and heart.




