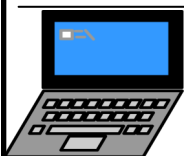

## COMPUTER TALK

We received a lot of great information this year by attending the computer class with our own guru, Paul Prosseda. I signed up 45 people but about half that number actually came. Each class was better than the last. The students brought their personal questions, and through the use of his computer which was projected onto our card room TV, Paul was able to solve these queries. Sometimes, he even went to someone's actual computer and helped them right there. For one session, I was happy to discuss Facebook, and I wrote some Facebook Instructions which can be found in the lobby on the counter. Regarding Windows 10, Paul is in favor of installing Classic Shell which will restore the original Windows 7 start menu to your machine so you will be less confused. He discussed downloading Malwarebytes Anti-Malware for your antispyware program. I also recommend Superantispyware which works very well, and Spyware Blaster, another free program that stops spyware before it can get into your computer. Paul discussed digital photography during the class. He recommended the program Irfanview for editing your digital photos. I personally use Windows Live Photo Gallery which has been great for me to organize all my photos into categories. I also like to name each photo and

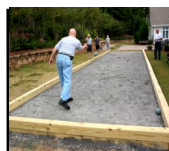

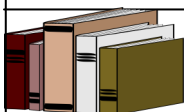

## OWNERS' PROPERTY SURVEY

Recently, several residents have requested information regarding individual property survey services. Our search for local firms to perform a "Boundary with Improvements Survey" has resulted in the following quotes:

The survey would locate corners and mark with iron rods (driven into the ground) flagged above ground and provide five signed and sealed drawings showing these features and any visible improvements on the property.

Each home owner is required to complete a work order and service agreement to proceed. Payment is required upon receipt of the drawing. This contract is completely between the home owner and the survey company. TW is not involved or a party to the work. The only request from TW is one copy of the survey for the owners' file in the office. Forms are available in the clubhouse lobby. Questions can be directed to our Manager or Harry Erikson.

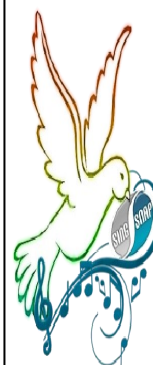

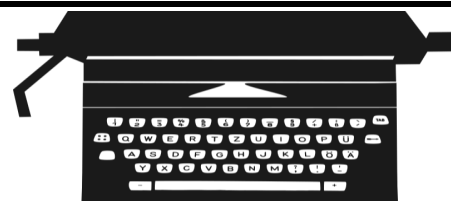

And the little boy grew up to attend the University of Nebraska in Lincoln on a full scholarship because of his ability as a high jumper. As an adult he became a supervisor at a meat packing plant called American Stores in Lincoln. However, the plant closed so he retrained in massage therapy and Reiki. His lovely wife, Kay, opened a restaurant in Lincoln in 1977 during this time period.

Fifteen years ago, Merle and Kay came to TW. In 2001, when they moved to Florida, Merle began his hobby of collecting shells (and some good-looking rocks.) Merle has probably crafted 300 birds and animals and collectible items. What happens to all of these treasures? Merle gives them away to people who come to his home. Who knew? Life passes as quick as a wink.

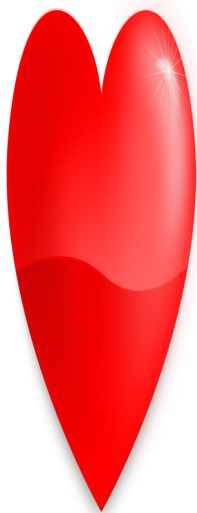

### ANOTHER NONAGENARIAN

Charlie Finkenbine's 91 years have been filled with the stuff of dreams. Listening to his many experiences brings to mind a little boy's fantasies. This amiable resident of Watersedge Street, born and raised in Ohio, moved, quite by accident, to our community in 2012. His sister, Carol Perise, lives in our community, and he also has family living in Sebring and Orlando. Charlie is a veteran of WWII, having enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1943. He was later called back up during the Cuban Missile Crisis in the 60's. In addition to his active duty, he spent 40 years in the Reserves. He has been involved in flying all of his working life. In fact, he taught Neil Armstrong to fly in a Ford Tri-Motor Champion. He is mentioned in two publications, one of them Neil Armstrong's book, and also in a History of Aviation in Ohio. Charlie ran the airport in Coldwater, MI, and was the director of training at Fort Rucker, AL, where he taught the gamut of flying from primary to basic through instrument. He finished his career in Albuquerque, NM, as a contractor to the Atomic Energy Commission which today is the Department of Energy. Here he began as a pilot but soon became Chief Pilot, then Director of Operations, and the last five years, he was General Manager. During this time, he transported hazardous, classified and nuclear cargoes. Charlie has flown in 67 different airplanes accruing 17,000 hours of flying time. During his time in Albuquerque, he met and married his wife Pat. He retired at 65, and the Finkenbines sold their home and bought a 40 foot Class A motorhome and traveled full-time. They have seven children, 11 grandchildren, 7 great-grandchildren, and 2 more are expected. Charlie, along with Pat, is deeply involved in his church, Redeemer Lutheran. In fact, Charlie played Santa Claus last year for many happy children. Charlie is a very busy, delightful nonagenarian. Retirement and age haven't slowed him down a bit.
